NR CHAPTER 80 – PESTICIDES

NR 80.02(2)	Cause death of wild animal through negligent or illegal use of pesticide (Z-1) (0-263.50)	100.00	26.00	137.50	263.50
NR 80.02(3)	Destroy game, fish, amphibians, reptiles by use of a pesticide, poison or toxic substance without a permit (Z-2) (0-263.50)	100.00	26.00	137.50	263.50
NR 80.02(4)	Fail to cover, protect or secure pesticide or pesticide treated material so as to prevent serious injury to wild animals other than those it is intended to control (Z-3) (0-263.50)	100.00	26.00	137.50	263.50
NR 80.02(5)	Fail to secure pesticide or pesticide treated material at point of storage (Z-4) (0-263.50)	100.00	26.00	137.50	263.50
NR 80.02(6)	Use, store, transport or display pesticide or pesticide treated materials contrary to label instructions or otherwise negligently (Z-5) (0-263.50)	100.00	26.00	137.50	263.50
NR 80.02(7)	Cause pesticide or pesticide treated materials to enter water of the state (Z-6) (0-263.50)	100.00	26.00	137.50	263.50
NR 80.02(8)	Fill or clean pesticide spray equipment from or adjacent to waters of the state (Z-7) (0-263.50)	100.00	26.00	137.50	263.50
NR 80.02(9)	Dispose of or hold pesticides contrary to label directions or in a manner which may contaminate waters of the state or create a hazard to wild animals other than those it is intended to control (Z-8) (0-263.50)	100.00	26.00	137.50	263.50
NR 80.02(10)	Fail to cover treated seeds during planting creating a hazard to wild animals other than those it is intended to control (Z-9) (0-263.50)	100.00	26.00	137.50	263.50

NR80.02(2) Except as otherwise provided in this chapter no person shall cause the death or destruction of any wild animal as defined in s. 29.001 (90), Stats., other than those to be controlled, through negligent use or illegal use of any pesticide (as defined in s. NR 80.01 (9)).

NR80.02(3) Except as noted in s. NR 80.03 (exemptions), it is unlawful for any person to destroy or control game or fish of any variety classified as such by s. 29.001, Stats., or amphibians or reptiles, by use of a pesticide, poison or toxic substance unless a permit for that purpose has been obtained from the department.

NR 80.02(4) Pesticides, seeds, seed pieces or other plant parts treated with a pesticide stored or held at outdoor locations, including loading or application sites, shall be covered or otherwise protected or secured to prevent serious injury to wild animals other than those it is intended to control.

NR 80.02(6) **No person shall use, store, transport or display pesticides, seeds, seed pieces or other plant parts treated with a pesticide contrary to label instructions or in a negligent manner so as to be a serious hazard to wild animals.** Any use, storage, transport or display of pesticides, seeds, seed pieces or other plant parts treated with a pesticide in violation of these rules, or any use of a pesticide, seeds, seed pieces or other plant parts treated with a pesticide which a person knows or ought to know creates a high degree of risk and probability of serious injury to wild animals other than those it is intended to control is negligent use.

29.601(3) DELETERIOUS SUBSTANCES.

(a) No person may throw or deposit, or permit to be thrown or deposited, into any waters within the jurisdiction of the state any lime, oil, tar, garbage, refuse, debris, etc., or any other substance deleterious to game or fish life

29.088(1) Use of poison and explosives: it is unlawful to use baits containing poison of any description in any forests, fields or other places where it might destroy or cause the destruction of wild animals or birds, and the possession of any poison or poison baits in a hunting or trapping camp or on any person while hunting or trapping shall be prima facie evidence of a violation.
